<b>Possible SLE</b> (requires a professional mentor in the student’s academy area)	<b>Not Possible SLE</b>
Job shadowing	Taking training classes (including dance intensives)
Assisting a teacher (not at MCST)	Attending Governor’s School
Teaching a class (related to academy, not at MCST)	Attending summer school or university classes
Working at a parent’s business with a professional mentor that is not the parent	Working for a parent
Computer Interning	Waitressing
Assisting in a lab	Cashiering
Stage managing	Web design/social media work/etc. without a professional mentor
